

Help decide which of the following resolutions from the February 6 precinct caucuses will be included in the 2018 DFL Ongoing Platform and Action Agenda.

Each of the 119 resolutions below was adopted in some form* by at least one of the precinct caucuses represented at today’s SD63 Convention. Today, SD63 can forward up to 64 of them on to the State Convention, where the final voting will occur. According to the rules proposed at the start of today’s convention, to be forwarded on, a resolution must be among the top 64 vote-getters today (exclusive of “Local or Party Issues” resolutions), and must be approved by more than 60% of the delegates who return their ballots.

(*NOTE: The SD63 Resolutions Committee edited some resolutions without changing their meaning. If you authored one of these resolutions, your exact language may not be here. See the note at the end of this document.)

Instructions:

1. **Mark your choices on this list (any way you want – this is not your final ballot).** You only need to mark the resolutions you approve of. You don’t need to vote “NO” for the resolutions you don’t want – simply don’t vote for them.
2. If you feel a resolution needs additional clarification or support, you will have an opportunity during the agenda to speak to the Convention about it.
3. **Transfer your votes onto the 1-page “RESOLUTION BALLOT” and then drop it in the collection box,** which will be placed prominently in the room. Make sure you get your ballot in before the announced time limit!
4. You can retain this document so you have a record of how you voted, and so you can follow the results.
5. We will do our best to announce the results before the convention adjourns. After the convention, results will be posted on the SD63 website (<http://sd63df.org/>).
